Programme Synopsis

Lecture Title:

Oral Care Strategies During Pediatric Oncology Therapy

Dr Elaine Tsao, Seattle Children's Hospital

This presentation will highlight the global challenges of pediatric oral health, emphasizing that many children arrive at cancer centers with pre-existing dental issues. We will review evidence-based oral care recommendations, including basic oral care bundles—such as supervised brushing with fluoridated toothpaste and appropriate use of rinses, and we will discuss possible adjuncts and alternatives. Special attention will be given to maintaining oral health during cancer therapy, with practical guidance on managing care when bleeding is anticipated or when ANC (absolute neutrophil count) values are a concern. The goal is to equip healthcare providers with practical strategies to improve oral health outcomes for children undergoing cancer treatment.

An Introduction to Oral Health in Children with Cancer and Interprofessional Education

Dr Yee Ruixiang, KK Women's and Children's Hospital

Clinical Assistant Professor Yee Ruixiang will share an overview of the importance of oral health in children with cancer. He will also give a brief introduction on how the new buzz in healthcare "Interprofessional team" practice/education differs from a traditional "multidisciplinary team" and how it may improve oral care in children with cancer.

She is a Fellow of the American Academy of Pediatric Dentistry and the American College of Dentists and is a diplomate of the American Board of Pediatric Dentistry.
